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SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 477,

Removing the jurisdiction for the regulation of the provision of driver education in school settings from the Department of Education will result in minor administrative savings to the department's Division of School Business Services.

This bill may increase prosecutions for Class E crimes. If a jail sentence is imposed, the additional costs to the counties are estimated to be \$83.22 per day per prisoner. These costs are not reimbursed by the State. The number of prosecutions that may result in a jail sentence and the resulting costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment restores the examination fee for a Class C operator's license at \$10, continues the current exemption for driver education teachers and noncommercial driver education schools from license fees until January 1, 1997, reestablishes license fees for commercial driver education schools and instructors at \$250 and \$125, respectively, until January 1, 1997, reduces license fees for driver education schools and instructors on January 1, 1997 and provides a delayed effective date of May 1, 1996 for transferring oversight responsibility to the Secretary of State.
