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B. Appointed by the Beard-ef-Trustees board of trustees as a vice-president, dean, director or member of the chanceller's, superintendent's or Maine Technical College System executive-director's president's immediate staff;

Sec. 6. 32 MRSA §6208-A, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1991, c. 456, §13, is further amended to read:

22 Membership. The State Board of Substance established by Title 5, section Counselors, 12004-A, 24 subsection 41, consists of 11 members. Nine members are appointed by the Governor. One member must be the Director of the Office of Substance Abuse or a designee. 26 One member, appointed by the Ghaneeller Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System, must be a member of the university faculty 28 involved in the training of substance abuse counselors. Of these 30 5 members must be licensed substance counselors. Two members must be nonproviders, one of whom must be a family member of a consumer of substance abuse services or a consumer of substance abuse services who has abstained from the use of alcohol and other drugs for a period of at least 2 years. 34 One member must be a public member. One member must be a representative of a regional alcohol and drug abuse council. 36 Members must represent a broad geographic distribution of the State and must be from among the professional associations 38 representative of the field.

Sec. 7. 32 MRSA §13852, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1991, c. 263, §2, is further amended to read:

2. Members. The board consists of 13 members, 12 of them appointed by the Governor. Each member must be a citizen of the United States and a resident of this State. Eight members must be licensed counseling professionals under this chapter, 2 of whom must be professional counselors, 2 must be clinical professional counselors, 2 must be marriage and family therapists and 2 must be pastoral counselors. Two members must be

registered counseling professionals who are not qualified for licensure. Each counselor member must have been, for at least 5 years immediately preceding appointment, actively engaged as a practitioner, educator or researcher. Two members must be representatives of the general public and may not be currently practicing counseling or receiving compensation for counseling services. One of the 2 public members must be a consumer of counseling services. One member, appointed by the Chanceller Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System, must be a member of the university faculty involved in the training of counselors.

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Sec. 8. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §4-A, as amended by PL 1987, c. 20, §3, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

Section 4-A. Administration; president, vice-presidents; advisory committees. The board of trustees shall appoint one person as president of the combined campuses. The president of the combined campuses may not serve concurrently as a member of the board of trustees. The board of trustees shall appoint one vice-president for each campus to assist the president with the day-to-day operation of each individual campus and the development of the academic program of each campus. The board of trustees shall appoint advisory committees on behalf of the various campuses and other advisory committees as necessary.

Sec. 9. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §4-B, as amended by PL 1987, c. 769, Pt. A, §§189 and 190, is further amended to read:

Section 4-B. Duties of the board of trustees and heads of the various campuses.

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1. Board of trustees; duties. The board of trustees,—in consultation—with—the—chancellor,—chall—be is the governing and planning body of the university and in—addition—shall—have has the responsibility for preparing and approving the operating and capital budgets of the university and presenting them in accordance with the direction in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1665, and Title 5, chapter 153.

2.-- Chancellor - and - staff - members; - duties. -- The - chancellor shall-exercise - such - powers - and -fulfill - such - responsibilities - as shall-be - delegated - by - the - board. -- The - chancellor - may -delegate - any of - such - powers - and -responsibilities - to - such - members - of - his - staff as - he - deems - necessary.

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3. President of the combined campuses. The head-of-each campus-shall-be president of the combined campuses is the chief administrative and educational officer thereof and shall-be is responsible for the day--to--day day-to-day operation and development of its the academic program of each campus within the

limits defined by the board of trustees and-the-chanceller; and, in addition, shall-exercise the president of the combined campuses has such rights and privileges as are generally recognized in the administering of admissions, curriculum development, extra-curricular extracurricular programs, leng fange long-range planning within the framework of the overall university plan, and supervision of faculty.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

- This bill eliminates the position and office of the Chancellor of the University of Maine System, eliminates the position of president for each campus and instead provides for one president for the combined campuses. To accomplish this, the bill:
- 18 1. Removes the chancellor from the list of ex officio corporators of the Board of Directors of the Maine Development Foundation;
- 22 2. Repeals the provision requiring the chancellor to present an address on the state of the University of Maine System to the Legislature;
- 3. Repeals the provision establishing a committee, appointed by the chancellor, whose reporting and implementation dates have passed;
- 30 4. Replaces the chancellor with a member representing the Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System on the New England Board of Higher Education;
- 5. Removes a reference to the chancellor in the laws concerning University of Maine System labor relations;
- 6. Requires the board of trustees rather than the chancellor to appoint a member to the State Board of Substance Abuse Counselors and a member to the Board of Counseling Professionals Licensure; and
- 7. Amends the charter of the University of Maine System to remove all references to and authority of the chancellor and to provide for one president for the combined campuses, with one vice-president appointed for each campus.
