Be	it	enacted	by	the	People	of	the	State	of	' Maine	as	follows:
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Sec. 1. P&SL 1899, c. 200, §5, as repealed and replaced by P&SL 1987, c. 33, §1, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

Sec. 5. Trustees. All the affairs of the Kennebec Water District must be managed by a board of trustees elected at the general election held in November of each even-numbered year. The board of trustees must consist of not less than 3 trustees, but no municipality or unorganized territory within the water district may have less than one trustee. Trustees serve 2-year terms and no individual may serve more than 3 terms consecutively.

Nominations and elections must be conducted in accordance with the general laws of this State.

The selection by the trustees of a chair, treasurer and clerk and any other necessary officers and agents employed by or serving the district, and compensation for any duties they perform, must be approved by a majority of the municipal officers of the municipality served by the district. When the district serves more than one municipality, approval is required by a majority vote of the municipal officers in each municipality in municipalities representing a majority of the population within the district. Compensation of the trustees must be similarly approved. Certification of the vote must be recorded with the Secretary of State and recorded in the bylaws of the district.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide greater oversight and accountability of the Kennebec Water District to the people it serves. This bill changes the configuration of the board of trustees and requires that trustee compensation and the selection by the trustees of a chair, treasurer and clerk be approved by a majority vote of the municipal officers of the municipalities representing a majority of the district's population.
