#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 37-B MRSA §607, as amended by PL 1983, c. 594, §32, 4 is further amended to read:

#### 6 §607. Admission

Veterans desiring admission to the home shall must apply on 8 forms prescribed by the administrator. Admission shall may be granted by the administrator only to eligible veterans who were 10 residents of Maine at the time of their entry into the United 12 States Armed Forces or who are residents of Maine at the time of application, and to the spouses, widows or widowers of eligible 14veterans, provided that suitable facilities are available. Admission shall must be granted when provisions of the rules are 16 met, when there is a vacancy and in order of application, unless For the purposes of this otherwise provided in the rules. section, "eligible veteran" includes a person who served on 18 active duty in the United States Armed Forces at any time during 20 the period from December 22, 1961 to August 5, 1964.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides that, for purposes of admission into Maine Veterans' Homes, eligible veterans include persons on active duty at any time during the period from December 22, 1961 to August 5, 1964.
