26	STATEMENT OF FACT
28	This bill repeals the ban on plastic 6-pack rings, scheduled to become effective 90 days after adjournment of the First
30	Regular Session of the 117th Legislature, and replaces it with a
32	ban on all ring holding devices that do not meet the degradability standards for plastic ring carriers adopted by the United States Environmental Protection Agency. The bill also
34	repeals a requirement that distributors of plastic ring holders and distributors of products that use plastic ring holders report
36	to the Maine Waste Management Agency the amount of ring holders recycled.
