Resolve, to Renew the State's Commitment to Family Planning Services for Low-income Women and Teens.

Sec. 1. Aid to Families with Dependent Children outreach 2 demonstration project. Resolved: That an Aid to Families with Dependent Children outreach demonstration project must be administered by the Department of Human Services, Bureau of 4 Income Maintenance to increase the voluntary use of family planning services by recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent 6 Children. The Bureau of Income Maintenance shall grant funds to a statewide association of family planning programs to carry out 8 the demonstration project. The demonstration project has the following components. 10

- A. Eight recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children must be recruited through the ASPIRE-JOBS Program
 to be trained as outreach workers providing direct, in-person family planning information to families receiving
 or at risk of receiving Aid to Families with Dependent Children. One outreach worker must be assigned to each of
 the State's family planning programs.
- B. During a 6-month training and start-up phase, outreach worker trainees may work no more than 20 hours per week.
 After the 6-month start-up phase, contingent on satisfactory job performance and continuation of state funding for the positions, the outreach workers must become permanent employees of the statewide association of family planning programs receiving the grant.
- C. By June 30, 1997, the recipient of the grant shall report the results of the demonstration project to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over human resource matters. The report must indicate the anticipated increased use of family planning services during the duration of the demonstration project by recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children, with specific identification of increased use by teens; and be it further
- Sec. 2. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.

2	STATEMENT OF FACT
4	This resolve restores funding to the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Health for family planning services that was
6	deappropriated in fiscal year 1994-95. It also establishes a 2-year demonstration project to train 8 recipients of Aid to
8	Families with Dependent Children to work with families in that program to increase their voluntary use of family planning
10	services to improve readiness for job training and placement in the workforce.
