2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §13019-F** is enacted to read:

6 **§13019-F. One-year conditional certificates for administrators**

8 An individual may be granted a one-year, nonrenewable conditional administrator certificate in a specific capacity if the individual:

10 1. **Conditional administrator certificate.** Will be employed in this State under that one-year nonrenewable conditional administrator certificate;

12 2. **Basic level knowledge areas.** Meets a majority of the basic level knowledge areas described in sections 13019-A, 13109-B and 13019-C; and

14 3. **Other requirements.** Meets other requirements in accordance with state board rules that are adopted pursuant to this section.

22 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

24 **26** This bill provides for conditional administrator certification for an administrator who is otherwise qualified for full certification but may lack completion in one or more of the competency areas. Conditional certification requires a specific time for the individual to complete requirements for full certification. The purpose of this bill is to expand the pool of qualified administrators to fill job vacancies.
