14	<u>THE PROPANE AND NATURAL GAS PROFESSIONAL</u> <u>ACT OF 1995</u>
16	<u>§2511. Short title</u>
18	This Act_may_be known_and_cited as the "Propane_and_Natural
10	Gas Professional Act of 1995."
20	<u> </u>
	<u>§2512. Definitions</u>
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	As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
24	indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
26	1. Board. "Board" means the Propane and Natural Gas
	Licensing Board.
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	2. Bulk plant. "Bulk plant" means a facility the primary
30	purpose of which is to distribute propane and that receives
	propane by tank car, tank truck or piping and distributes this
32	propane to the end user by portable container delivery, by tank
2.4	truck or through piping. A bulk plant has the bulk storage
34	capacity of 2,000 gallons of water or more and usually has
36	<u>container filling and truck loading facilities on the premises.</u> Normally no one other than the plant management or plant
30	employees has access to these facilities. Bulk plant includes a
38	facility that transfers propane from tank cars on a private track
50	directly into cargo tanks.
40	
	3. Delivery. "Delivery" means the transfer of propane,
42	either by liquid transfer into a stationary container on the
	property of the consumer or by placing a portable propane
44	container onto the property of the consumer.
46	4. Dispensing station. "Dispensing station" means a
	facility consisting of fixed equipment where propane is stored
48	and dispensed into containers that are not suitable for the
	<u>shipping of cargo and that are mounted on vehicles or into</u>
50	portable containers.

5. Natural gas. "Natural gas" means hydrocarbon fuel in a gaseous state with a composition of predominantly CH4, delivered
 by pipeline to the property or the consumer.

 6 <u>6. Propane. "Propane" means a hydrocarbon whose chemical</u> composition is predominantly C3H8, whether recovered from natural
 8 gas or crude oil.

10 §2513. Board established

12 There is established an independent board for the purposes of overseeing the propane and natural gas licensure program, for 14 advising State Government on matters relating to the enforcement of this Act, for overseeing the development of rules and 16 legislation relating to the implementation of this Act, for expending the funds raised pursuant to the Act and for overseeing 18 the personnel of the state agency that enforces this Act.

20 **<u>1. Board name.</u>** The name of the board is the "Propane and Natural Gas Licensing Board."

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2. Membership: appointment. The board consists of 7 24 members who serve for 3-year staggered terms; except that of the initial appointees 3 of the members serve a 3-year term, 2 of the 26 members serve a 2-year term and 2 of the members serve a one-year term. All members are appointed by the Governor from 28 recommendations of the state propane and natural gas industries, as follows: 30

- A. Five members representing industry, 3 of whom come from the propane industry, one of whom is a mechanical contractor and one of whom comes from the natural gas industry; and
- B. Two members representing the general public who are unrelated, either directly or indirectly, to either the natural gas or propane industry.

3. Officers. At its first meeting, the board shall choose
 a chair and a vice-chair who serve terms of one year. The vice-chair serves as chair the following year unless unwilling or
 unable. The board may elect such other officers as it finds necessary.

4. Compensation. Members of the board serve without 46 compensation but may be reimbursed for expenses.

48 §2514. Board powers

50 The board has the following powers.

	1. Biennial budget. The board shall develop a biennial
2	budget. For its first 5 years, annual expenses may not exceed
4	\$50,000 for the first year, \$120,000 for the 2nd year, \$123,000
4	for the 3rd year, \$127,000 for the 4th year and \$131,000 for the
6	<u>5th year.</u>
0	At a minimum, the budget must include the following information:
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	A. The expenditures the board intends to make in the
10	following year, broken down by type and amount of
	expenditure; and

	The board shall hold a public hearing, pursuant to the Maine
18	Administrative Procedure Act and hear public comment with respect
	to the budget proposed by the board.

2.2	2. Rules. The board shall develop and adopt rules pursuant
22	to the Maine Administrative Procedure Act to implement the licensure requirements established by this Act, which may include
24	the following:
26	A. The education or experience requirements for applicants
	<u>for licensure;</u>
28	
	B. How a licensed propane or natural gas professional may
30	move among the various categories of licensure;
32	C. Standards of professional conduct designed to raise the
52	standards of professional behavior within the categories of
34	licensure overseen by the board; and
36	D. Procedures within which violations of this Act or board
	rules constitute withdrawal of a license and for the timely
38	appeal of a board decision in this regard.
40	3. Oversight authority. The board exercises oversight
40	authority over those employed by State Government under the
42	conditions of this Act as follows:
44	A. The board receives reports concerning the activities of
	those employed by State Government under the conditions of
46	this Act; and
48	B. The board may recommend to State Government the priority
ŦŬ	of activities undertaken by those employed by State
50	Government under the conditions of this Act.

2	4. Contract for services. The board has the power to
	contract for services the board requires, including, but not
4	limited to, legal counsel, inspectors, clerical and other support
	staff, housing and appropriate offices and meeting space for the
6	board and services relating to the enforcement of rules adopted
	pursuant to this Act.
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•	5. Promote education and research. The board acts to
10	promote propane education and research within the State and may
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	be established nationally within the United States Department of
12	Energy or its successor agency.
14	Accounts; subject to audit. The board shall ensure,
	within 90 days of the end of each fiscal year, that the accounts
16	and funds held in the Propane and Natural Gas Licensing Fund are
	subjected to a complete independent audit, the results of which
18	are public and must be made available upon request and
10	communicated to the members of the joint standing committee of
20	the Legislature having jurisdiction over business and economic
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	matters, or its successor committee, at the beginning of each
22	session of the Legislature.
24	Upon completion of the independent audit, the board shall review
	the audit results at a meeting of the board and provide an
26	opportunity for public comment on the audit.
28	At a minimum, the audit must include, but is not limited to:
30	A. A complete accounting of all receipts received by the
50	board during the fiscal year;
2.2	board during the ristar year;
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	B. A complete accounting of all expenditures made by the
34	board during the fiscal year; and
36	C. An analysis of the extent to which the funds collected
	by the board meet the requirements of the operations of the
38	board.
40	7. Maintain records The board shall keep minutes books

40 7. Maintain records. The board shall keep minutes, books and records that clearly reflect all of the acts and transactions 42 of the board. These papers and other materials must be made available for public inspection upon request. 44

8. Public notice of meetings. The board's meetings must be conducted only after suitable public notice as prescribed by the 46 Maine Administrative Procedure Act and all measures taken by the board are pursuant to the Maine Administrative Procedure Act. 48

9. Recommendations. The board may make recommendations to the Legislature concerning changes to this Act. 2

4	10. Standards for installation of equipment. The board
	shall establish by rule technical standards for the proper
б	installation and servicing of propane and natural gas equipment.
	These standards must be in accordance with the National Fire
8	Protection Association Standards, numbers 54 and 58. The board
	may adopt by rule other state and local standards it finds
10	necessary.
12	§2515. Installations to conform to standards; authority of
	inspectors
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	Installation of propane or natural gas equipment may not be
16	made in the State unless it complies with all the standards and
	rules adopted by the board.
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	The inspectors authorized by the board to enforce this Act
20	have powers similar to those that sheriffs have in their
	respective counties, relating to enforcement of this Act and
22	rules adopted under this Act. These powers are limited to the
	issuing of citations, the serving of summonses, the conducting of
24	investigations and the ordering of corrections of violations of
	this Act by licensees in accordance with the specific statutory
26	authority set forth in this Act. If an inspector finds any
	propane or natural gas installation that does not comply with
28	this Act, the inspector shall order that the installation be
	<u>removed or remedied and that order must be complied with</u>
30	immediately by the owner or occupant of the premises or building
	<u>or the installer of the propane or natural gas equipment in</u>
32	violation. If the inspector finds any propane or natural gas
	installation in any building or structure that creates a danger
34	to other property or to the public, the inspector may forbid the
	<u>use of the building or structure by serving a written order upon</u>
36	the owner and occupant, if any, to vacate within a reasonable
	<u>period of time to be stated in the order.</u>
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	§2516. Investigation of complaints; suspension or revocation of
40	licenses
42	The board shall investigate all complaints made to it and
	all cases of noncompliance with or violation of this Act. The
44	board may suspend or revoke a license issued under this Act
	pursuant to Title 5, section 10004. The board may refuse to
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issue or renew a license or the Administrative Court may suspend, 46 revoke or refuse to renew the license of any licensee who is 48

found guilty of:

1. Fraud or deceit. The practice of fraud or deceit in 2 obtaining a license;

- 2. Negligence or misconduct. Any gross negligence, incompetence or misconduct in the performance of the work of
 making installations. Continued failure to conform to standards or rules adopted by the board is prima facie evidence of gross
 negligence or incompetence; or
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3. Violations. Any violation of this Act.

- 12 <u>A license suspended by the board or suspended or revoked by the Administrative Court must be immediately surrendered to the board and held during any period of suspension or, if revoked, until reinstated as provided in this Act.</u>
- There is no appeal from the failure of the board to issue a18license as a result of an applicant failing to pass an
examination when the results of the examination are unanimously20certified by the board as correct.
- A person whose license is suspended or revoked for more than 90 days must establish that all requirements governing new applicants under this Act are met as a condition of reinstatement or return of the license, except that the board may in its discretion, giving due consideration to the protection of the public, waive examination if the period of suspension is less than 2 years or, in the case of revocation of license, the applicant is both eligible and has made application for reinstatement of license within 2 years of the effective date of revocation.

§2517. Licensure; requirements; persons

1. Establish license.The board shall establish one36license with endorsements described in this section that conform
to the education and certification requirements of the National38Propane Gas Association's Certified Employee Training Program or
other propane or natural gas programs approved by the board, as40follows:42A. "Delivery technician" is the person who delivers propane
at a customer's location. A license established by the
board is not required by a delivery technician to operate a
motor vehicle;

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- B. "Plant operator" is a person who works at a bulk plant and handles propane and propane equipment;

C. "Tank setter and outside piping technician" is the person who sets and maintains propane tanks and outside 2 piping; and 4 D. "Appliance connection and service technician" is the person who installs and services propane and natural gas 6 appliances and indoor piping. 8 2. License; valid. The license established in this section 10 is valid for 2 years. 3. Appropriate endorsement. The board shall issue a 12 license with the appropriate endorsement to the prospective 14 licensee who has successfully passed an examination as prescribed by the board and who has paid any required fee. 16 4. Properly licensed. A person may not perform the functions governed by this Act after July 1, 1997 without first 18 being properly licensed by the board, except that plant operators must be licensed within one year of first performing those 20 functions. In order to qualify for the one-year provision, the 22 delivery technician or plant operator must register with the board within 90 days of first performing that function. 24 5. Examination; qualification. Notwithstanding any requirement set by the board as a gualification to sit for a 26 license examination, those working in the propane or natural gas industry before January 1, 1996 are deemed qualified to sit for a 28 license examination. 30 §2518. Licensure; installation and maintenance standards; 32 dispensing stations 34 The following registration, licensing, maintenance and installation standards apply to dispensing stations operating in the State. 36 1. Dispensing stations. All dispensing stations must be 38 registered biennially by the owner upon suitable forms, as 40 designated and approved by the board, with the agency of the state responsible for the enforcement of this Act as specified in 42 section 2519. A dispensing station that undergoes a major repair, revision or relocation must provide that agency with 44 updated information within 30 days of the completion of the change. 46 2. Registration. Registration of the dispensing station is 48 limited to: 50 A. The name of the owner;

2	B. The address of the dispensing station;
4	<u>C. The town or city and county in which the dispensing</u> station is located;
6	D. The directions to the dispensing station;
8	E. The capacity in gallons of the dispensing station;
10	F. The name of the owner or operator to be contacted for
12	inspection of the dispensing station by the State; and
14	<u>G. The name of the owner or operator holding the limited operator's license required by this section.</u>
16	3. Constructed; maintained; operated. Dispensing stations
18	operating in the State must be constructed, maintained and operated in accordance with the standards set by the most recent
20	edition of National Fire Protection Association Standards, number 58. The board may adopt by rule additional state and local codes.
22	4. Limited operator's license; training. The on-site owner
24	or operator of a dispensing station must hold a limited operator's license issued biennially by the board. The board may
26	set by rule the requirements for obtaining the limited license. The holder of the limited license is responsible for training
28	other dispensing station employees and documenting that training.
30	<u>The training must include the Propane Gas Association of New</u> England's "Fill Plant Manual" and the National Propane Gas
32	Association's video "Fill It or Not" or equivalent materials approved by the board. The training documentation must be kept
34	at the station. The owner of the dispensing station is responsible for compliance and is subject to section 2519.
36	<u>\$2519. Equipment registration</u>
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40	Following the installation and testing of vented natural gas or propane equipment, the installer must attach a permanent tag in a conspicuous place on or near the equipment, showing the name
42	and license number of the installer and the date of the
44	installation or testing and the type of work done on that date. Each tag must include a detachable copy that must be removed by
46	the installer and sent to the board within 5 days of the installation and testing along with a registration fee to be set
48	by the board by rule not to exceed \$3.
50	§2520. Enforcement; powers; penalties

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	The police powers of the State rest with the agency of State
2	<u>Government with whom the board reaches agreement for the</u>
	<u>enforcement of this Act. The agency of State Government</u>
4	enforcing this Act may assess the following penalties.
б	1. Penalty. For the violation of:
8	A. Section 2517, a penalty not to exceed \$500; and
10	B. Section 2518, a penalty not to exceed \$500.
12	All funds collected from the enforcement of this section must be remitted to the board and deposited in the Propane and
14	Natural Gas Licensing Fund.
16	<u>A person or company subject to the enforcement actions of this section has a right of appeal to the board within 30 days of</u>
18	the enforcement action. The board's decision may be appealed to the Superior Court.
20	An inspector or other person enforcing this Act as an
22	employee or agent of the agency of State Government contracted by the board must meet the same qualifications as those licensed
24	under this Act.
26	§2521. Fund established
28	The Propane and Natural Gas Licensing Fund is established for the use of the board, the proceeds of which must be deposited
30	in a bank or banks that are members of the Federal Reserve System. The fund must be used for the purposes of this Act.
32	<u>§2522. Fees</u>
34	The board may establish fees. The fees must be remitted in
36	a manner and on forms or other instruments prescribed by the board.
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40	1. License; biennial fee. The biennial fee for the license established in section 2517 may not exceed \$130. There is no additional fee for additional endorsements.
42	additional iee for additional endorsements.
14	2. Dispensing station. The biennial registration fee for a
44	dispensing station must be set by the board and may not exceed \$196.
46	
	3. Limited license. There is no fee for the limited
48	license established in section 2518 if the owner has registered the dispensing station as required by this Act.
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<u>4. Examination; fees. The board may set reasonable fees
 2 for whatever examinations it may require as long as the fees
 cover the actual costs of the examination.
</u>

5. Late renewals. The board may establish by rule a policy
 and penalties for late license and registration renewals.

8 §2523. Administrative procedures

 In order to ensure that the board's activities are open and subject to full public participation, all actions and activities
 of the board and its contracted enforcement agency are conducted in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act.

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§2524. Judicial review

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A person subject to penalties under section 2515, 2516 or 18 2520 has the right to appeal the board's decision to any Superior Court of the State.

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§2525. Right of private action

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A person or company regulated pursuant to this Act has a right of private action and may maintain a civil action in Superior Court against a violator of this Act. In any action, the Superior Court shall enter a temporary, preliminary or permanent injunction to restrain further violations or threatened violations of this Act.

30 §2526. Legislative review; repeal

32 This Act is repealed July 1, 2000, unless reauthorized by an act of the Legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACT

38 This bill establishes the Propane and Natural Gas Licensing Board to regulate those who install and maintain propane and 40 natural gas equipment and set standards for the proper installation of the equipment. The board also licenses plant 42 operators and dispensing stations and their operators.

44 The board is independent of State Government but has its enforcement activities conducted by an agency of State Government 46 and its operations are subject to the Maine Administrative Procedure Act.
