HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 507, L.D. 1366, "Resolve, to Provide Clear Title for the Maine Judicial Center"

Amend the resolve in section 2 in the last line (page 2, line 7 in L.D.) by striking the following: "resolve." and inserting in its place the following: 'resolve; and be it further'

Further amend the resolve by adding after section 2 the following:

**'Sec. 3. Payment in lieu of property taxes. Resolved:** That the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court may enter into an agreement with the municipal officers of the City of Augusta to make payments in lieu of property taxes with regard to the property at 65 Stone Street in Augusta that is exempt from taxation under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, Part 2. The Chief Justice may make payment from any funds available to the Judicial Department. This section does not apply to property that is used for judicial proceedings.'

Further amend the resolve by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

**'FISCAL NOTE**

If the Judicial Department enters into an agreement with municipal officers to make payments in lieu of property taxes, the department will require additional General Fund appropriations to make these payments. The amounts can not be estimated at this time.'

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 507, L.D. 1366

**STATEMENT OF FACT**

This amendment authorizes the Judicial Department to make payments in lieu of property taxes on the property at 65 Stone Street in Augusta that is used for administrative purposes. The resolve does not apply to property used for judicial purposes.

This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the resolve.
