30	Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:

34	'Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §443-A, as amended by PL 1979, c. 731, §19, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
36	<u>§443-A. Native produce</u>
38	1. Prohibition. Farm produce sold or offered for sale within the State may not be labeled or advertised as "native,"
40	"native-grown," "locally grown" or by a similar designation, unless that product was actually grown in the State.
42	
44	2. Penalty. Violation of subsection 1 is a civil violation punishable by a fine of not less than \$200 nor more than \$300.
46	3. Burden of proof. The burden of proof concerning the origin of farm produce is on the seller. The burden may be met
48	by written documentation showing the origin of farm produce.
50	4. Enforcement. This section is enforced by the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources.'

	The amendment alters current law regarding the labeling of
14	farm produce by placing on the seller the burden of proof for
	identifying the origin of farm produce. It also increases the
16	fines for a violation from a minimum of \$100 to a minimum of \$200
	and from a maximum of \$200 to a maximum of \$300.
18	
	The amendment also adds a fiscal note.
