A Except in Cumberland County, a register of deeds shall

Vacancies shall must be filled for the unexpired term by election as provided for in section 602 at the next general
election, as defined in Title 21-A, section 1, subsection 19, after their occurrence. In the meantime, the Governor may fill
vacancies by appointment, and the person so appointed shall hold office until the first day of January next after the election.
Until a vacancy is filled by appointment by the Governor, the deputy register shall serve as acting register as provided in
section 605.

16 The provisions of this chapter do not apply to Cumberland County. In that county, the county manager or the manager's 18 designee shall perform the functions of the register of deeds as provided in Title 30-A, section 82, subsection 5, paragraph C.
20 The Cumberland County Manager has the authority granted to registers of deeds under this chapter and is subject to the
22 requirements of this chapter.

Sec. 8. Transition. The county treasurer and register of deeds on the effective date of this Act shall serve out the remainder of the term of office to which they were elected. The county commissioners, by resolve, may provide for the orderly transition to the county manager form of government. A resolve may not infringe upon the rights of any official or employee and must be consistent with this Act.

Cumberland County Commissioners on the effective date of this Act may continue to hold office through December 31, 1995.
Notwithstanding Title 30-A, section 61, subsection 2, the initial selection of the 5 Cumberland County Commissioners established in this Act must take place at a special election in November 1995. Terms of the 5 new commissioners begin January 1, 1996. Three of the initial members must be elected for 3-year terms and 2 for 1-year terms; subsequent members serve 4-year terms.

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The members of the Cumberland County Budget Advisorv Committee on the effective date of this Act may continue to hold 42 that office through September 31, 1995. At that time, the terms 44 of members of the budget advisory committee terminate. Before October 1, 1995, municipal officers in each of the 5 county 46 commissioner districts shall caucus and shall elect municipal officers from each district as county commissioners as provided 48 in Title 30-A, section 743, subsection 1, paragraph A. Terms of the newly elected county commissioners begin on October 1, 1995.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill restructures Cumberland County government, establishing in place of the current structure a county manager 6 form of government and a 5-member board of county commissioners. into county 8 The county is reapportioned 5 commissioner districts. New commissioners to be chosen at a special election in November 1995 take office January 1, 1996. 10 The bill establishes the position of Cumberland County Manager. The county manager is hired by the county commissioners and works 12 under the direction of the county commissioners in executing the policy directives of the commissioners and managing the 14 day-to-day operations of county government. The county manager is responsible for the tasks commonly performed by the county 16 clerk, county treasurer and register of deeds. With input from the commissioners, the manager annually prepares the proposed 18 county budget for approval of the commissioners. The positions of Cumberland County Treasurer and Cumberland County Register of 20 Deeds are eliminated following expiration of their current terms 22 of office. The Cumberland County Budget Advisory Committee continues in existence with expanded membership to reflect the increase in the number of county commissioner districts. 24
