2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1579-A, sub-§1, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1987, c.
4	191, is amended to read:
6	A. "Restaurant" means any enclosed indoor restaurant or other enclosed indoor establishment which that invites the
8	public to be served food for consumption on the premises, including establishments with lunch counters.
10	Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §1579-A, sub-§2, ¶D is enacted to read:
12	D. Notwithstanding paragraphs A and B, restaurants that
14	contain seating for 25 patrons or less entirely within one room may designate the entire room for smoking provided they
16	display prominently, at or near the entrance, a sign indicating that smoking is allowed in all of the restaurant.
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20	STATEMENT OF FACT
22	This bill allows restaurants and establishments with lunch counters that seat 25 patrons or less to designate the entire
24	restaurant for smoking use if they post a sign at or near the entrance stating that smoking is allowed in all of the restaurant.

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
