Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 15 MRSA §1103 is enacted to read:
§1103. Optional polygraph examination
1. Definitions. For purposes of this section the terms
"polygraph" and "polygraph examination" have the same meanings as
in Title 32, section 7153.
2. Option of person charged. A person charged with a crime
under state law who requests to be given a polygraph examination
must be given the opportunity to have a polygraph examination.
STATEMENT OF FACT
This bill defines polygraph and polygraph examination as in
the current licensing provisions for polygraph examiners, and
accords persons charged with crimes the opportunity to have a
polygraph examination on their request.
