Resolve, Directing the State Planning Office to Improve the Coordination of State Agencies and Resources Involved in Projects Having an Environmental Significance.

Sec. 1. Establish coordinating mechanism. Resolved: That the 2 State Planning Office establish a coordinating mechanism and data-base tracking system for environmentally significant projects that identify these projects in one of 3 categories as Δ follows: 6 Complex environmental project. This category includes 1. any project that requires extensive involvement of 3 or more 8 agencies to solve environmental issues. These projects are 10 coordinated by the State Planning Office; 12 2. Major environmental projects. This category includes any project in which the primary involvement is within 2 agencies to solve environmental issues. One agency is designated by the 14 projects in this category as the lead agency, which may provide the coordination with any other agency involved; and 16 Single agency environmental projects. 18 This category 3. includes any significant environmental project in which the primary involvement is located within one agency that is the 20 agency responsible for all coordination of the project; and be it further 22 Sec. 2. Implementing legislation. Resolved: That the State 24 Planning Office submit implementing legislation necessary to carry out the purpose of this resolve to the joint standing 26 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resource matters no later than December 1, 1995. The committee 28 may report out a bill based on the proposals of the State 30 Planning Office. 32 STATEMENT OF FACT 34 This resolve requires the State Planning Office to establish

36 a coordinating mechanism for environmentally significant projects based on certain criteria.
