The Department of Marine Resources will require additional 8 General Fund appropriations of \$840,945 and \$805,929 in fiscal years 1995-96 and 1996-97, respectively, for the enforcement 10 costs of increasing the jurisdictional area of coastal waters.

12 The Department of Marine Resources will require an Other Special Revenue fund allocation of \$20,077 in fiscal year 1995-96 14 for continuation of the Groundfish Hatchery Fund for one additional year. Continuation of the fund will also result in an 16 equivalent increase in dedicated revenues collected by the fund.

18 This bill may increase prosecutions for Class D crimes. If a jail sentence is imposed, the additional costs to the counties 20 are estimated to be \$83.22 per day per prisoner. These costs are not reimbursed by the State. The number of prosecutions that may 22 result in a jail sentence and the resulting costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

The additional workload, administrative costs and indigent defense costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

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### STATEMENT OF FACT

The amendment replaces the original bill. It asserts state 36 control of waters out to 12 miles from Maine's coast. It also allows the Commissioner of Marine Resources to adopt rules for 38 any zones created within the coastal waters.

40 It strikes the July 30, 1995 repeal date for the Groundfish Hatchery Fund and replaces it with a repeal date of July 30,
42 1996. It also requires that fund balances be carried forward.

44 The amendment adds an emergency preamble, an emergency clause and a fiscal note to the bill.

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
