Be	it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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321	2. Maine Adopt-A-River Program Act
<u>Ado</u>	This subchapter may be known and cited as the Maine pt-A-River Program Act.
<u>§57</u>	3. Program established; responsibilities
<u>sub</u>	The Maine Adopt-A-River Program, referred to in this chapter as the "program," is established.
	1. Administration. The Bureau of Parks and Recreation 11 administer the program, which is designed to remove litter
inc	m and to beautify the rivers of this State. The program may lude public informational activities, but is directed marily toward encouraging and facilitating involvement of
	unteer groups in litter cleanup work by assigning each group a specific river or stream segment.
	2. Rules. The Bureau of Parks and Recreation may adopt
<u>rul</u>	es necessary for implementation of the program.
	3. Agreement. An agreement between the Bureau of Parks and reation and a volunteer group entered into under subsection 1 t include but is not limited to:
	A. Identification of the designated river or stream
	segment. The volunteer group may request a specific segment of the river or stream it wishes to adopt but the assignment is at the discretion of the Bureau of Parks and Recreation.
	In assigning sections of a river, the Bureau of Parks and Recreation shall coordinate and cooperate with affected
	federal, state and local management agencies and private landowners;
	B. Specification of the duties of the volunteer group. The volunteer group shall remove litter along the designated
	river or stream segment at least once each year;
	C. Specification of the responsibilities of the volunteer group. The volunteer group must abide by all rules related to the program that are adopted by the Bureau of Parks and
	Recreation; and

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2 <u>D. Duration of the agreement. An agreement to care for the designated river or stream segment must be for at least 2</u>
4 <u>years.</u>

6 **4. Recognition program.** The Bureau of Parks and Recreation shall create a recognition program to acknowledge the efforts of 8 volunteer groups, agencies and businesses that participate in the program.

5. Providing assistance. The Bureau of Parks and 12 Recreation shall provide trash bags, safety information and assistance to the participating volunteer groups.

6. Large items found. The Bureau of Parks and Recreation 16 shall facilitate the removal of large or heavy items from a river or stream segment if items are found by a volunteer group.

<u>§574. Annual report</u>

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The Bureau of Parks and Recreation shall report annually by January 1st to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over conservation matters on the implementation and progress of the program established pursuant to this Act.

STATEMENT OF FACT

30 This bill establishes the Maine Adopt-A-River Program administered by the Bureau of Parks and Recreation. It is based 32 on an Oregon law and is a volunteer program to remove litter from state rivers.
