8	Commission. The State Telecommunications Network Coordination Commission, as established by section 12004-I, subsection 6-E and						
10	referred to in this section as the "commission," is created to develop and maintain a telecommunications network plan for the

14	2. Membership. The commission consists of no more than 20 members appointed by the Governor from among applications						
16	submitted to the Governor. The appointees must be selected on the basis of expertise, experience and interest in						
18	telecommunications and may include carriers and vendors; broadcast and print media professionals; representatives from						
20	university, government, law enforcement and medical service entities; representatives from schools, administrative districts						
22	and school unions; consumers; and other professionals from the public and private sectors. All appointments must be made within						
24	30 days of the effective date of this section.						
26	3. Term of office. The term of office for members is 3						
28	years, except that 1/3 of the initial appointments must be for one-year terms; 1/3 for 2-year terms; and 1/3 for 3-year terms.						
30	Commission members shall elect annually a chair from among the membership by majority vote. A vacancy must be filled by the						
32	Governor to complete the term of the appointee who vacated the office.
