An Act to Create a Special Accidental Death Benefit for the Surviving Family Members of Law Enforcement Officers Killed in the Line of Duty.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §18001, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 801, §§5 and 7, is repealed and the following enacted in its place: 4 §18001. Definitions 6 As used in this article, unless the context otherwise 8 indicates, the following terms have the following meanings. 10 1. Law enforcement officer. "Law enforcement officer" 12 means a state police officer, as defined by the Bureau of State Police; an inland fisheries and wildlife officer, as defined by 14 the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife; a marine patrol officer, as defined by the Department of Marine Resources; or a county or municipal law enforcement officer who participates in 16 the retirement system through employment with a participating local district as described in section 18201. 18 20 2. Qualifying member. "Qualifying member" means a member who dies as a result of an injury arising out of and in the course of employment as an employee or a former member receiving 22 a disability retirement benefit who dies as a result of an injury 24 arising out of and in the course of employment as an employee. Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §18003, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 801, §§5 and 26 7, is amended to read: 28 §18003. Computation of benefit 30 Surviving spouse; no dependent children. 1. If the 32 qualifying member is survived by a spouse and no dependent child, the surviving spouse shall <u>must</u> be paid 2/3 of the average final 34 compensation of the qualifying member, except that if the qualifying member is a law enforcement officer, the surviving 36 spouse must be paid an annual sum equal to the annual rate of earnable compensation the law enforcement officer was receiving 38 at the time of the officer's death. 40 Surviving spouse having care of dependent children. 2. Τf the qualifying member is survived by a spouse who has the care of the dependent child or dependent children of the qualifying 42 member, the surviving spouse shall must be paid an annual sum 44 equal to the average final compensation of the qualifying member. except that if the qualifying member is a law enforcement officer, the surviving spouse must be paid an annual sum equal to 46 the annual rate of earnable compensation the law enforcement 48 officer was receiving at the time of the officer's death.

Surviving spouse not having care of dependent children. 3. If the qualifying member is survived by a spouse who does not 2 have the care of the dependent child or dependent children of the qualifying member, the surviving spouse shall share with the 4 dependent child or dependent children an annual sum equal to the average final compensation of the qualifying member, the benefit 6 to be divided equally among the surviving spouse and the 8 dependent child or dependent children, except that if the qualifying member is a law enforcement officer, the surviving spouse shall share with the dependent child or dependent children 10 an annual sum equal to the annual rate of earnable compensation the law enforcement officer was receiving at the time of the 12 officer's death, the benefit to be divided equally among the surviving spouse and the dependent child or dependent children. 14

16 4. No surviving spouse. If no spouse survives the qualifying member, the dependent child or dependent children shall must be paid an annual sum equal to the average final compensation of the qualifying member, except that if the qualifying member is a law enforcement officer, the dependent child or dependent children must be paid an annual sum equal to the annual rate of earnable compensation the law enforcement officer's death.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

28 This bill creates a special accidental death benefit for the surviving family members of a law enforcement officer who 30 participates in the Maine State Retirement System and who dies as a result of an injury arising out of and in the course of the 32 officer's employment.
