12 Sec. 2. Contents of report and implementing legislation. Resolved: That in the report and proposed implementing legislation required in section 1 of this resolve, the Department of Education shall:

 Address the different levels of services available to exceptional children at different public schools throughout the State and propose methods of equalizing access to educational services and improving learning results for students with special needs;

22 2. Review the policies and procedures related to special education due process, including all issues related to the 24 transfer of exceptional students from one public school to another public school;

Study and develop strategies to ensure that schools and
 teachers are prepared to identify children with learning
 disabilities, attention deficit disorder and attention deficit
 disorder with hyperactivity; and

Review the educational needs of students with learning disabilities, attention deficit disorder and attention deficit
 disorder with hyperactivity and explore educational programs designed to meet those needs.

The Department of Education shall ensure that the report and proposed implementing legislation do not provide incentives to schools to neglect their obligations to provide appropriate education to exceptional children; and be it further

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## COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

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Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

## **'FISCAL NOTE**

The Division of Special Services within the Department of Education will incur some minor additional costs to report and provide implementing legislation related to educational services for exceptional children. These costs can be absorbed within the division's existing budgeted resources.'

## **STATEMENT OF FACT**

16 The resolve requires the Department of Education, in consultation with various interested parties, to propose methods to ensure educational opportunities and equalize access to educational services for exceptional children.

This amendment directs the Department of Education to 22 include in its report recommendations concerning special education due process, strategies for identifying students with learning disabilities and attention deficit disorders, 24 and programs to meet the needs of students with learning disabilities 26 and attention deficit disorders. The amendment also adds a fiscal note.
