Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §441, as repealed and replaced by PL 1979, c. 672, Pt. A, §16, is amended to read:

6 **§441. Rules**

8 The commissioner may prescribe, in a manner consistent with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, rules and-regulations for 10 carrying out this subchapter, including the fixing of fees to be charged any individual, firm or organization requesting an inspection pursuant to section 446 or receiving an inspection 12 pursuant to section 951. These fees shall must, as nearly as possible, cover the costs of the inspection services for the 14 commodity inspected. All fees collected shall must be paid by the commissioner to the Treasurer of State and are appropriated 16 for the purposes of this subchapter. Any unexpended balance from 18 the funds thus appropriated shall may not lapse, but shall must be carried forward to the same fund for the next fiscal year.

Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §951, as amended by PL 1979, c. 731, §19, is further amended by adding at the end 2 new paragraphs to read:

- 24 Notwithstanding the provisions of article 4, the commissioner after consultation with the Maine Potato Board may require, by rules adopted pursuant to the Maine Administrative 26 Procedure Act, the inspection of all or a portion of consumer 28 packs of potatoes for conformity with the U.S. #1 grade or other grades. Inspection under any rule adopted pursuant to this section must be performed by a licensed federal-state potato 30 inspector, state potato inspector or seed potato inspector. At the request of and in consultation with the Maine Potato Board, 32 the commissioner shall initiate rulemaking to require inspection 34 of consumer packs of potatoes.
- 36 <u>A person who violates rules adopted under this section</u> commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture not to exceed 38 \$1,000 for the first offense and \$2,000 for any subsequent offense may be adjudged.

STATEMENT OF FACT

44 This bill is legislation recommended by the Commission to Study Potato Quality Issues. This bill establishes the legal 46 authority for the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural 87 Resources to require through rulemaking inspection for specific 48 grades of consumer packs of Maine potatoes. The commissioner 48 must initiate rulemaking to require inspection at the request of 50 the Maine Potato Board.
