22	Sec. 1. Commission established. The Commission on the Economic
24	Impact of Time-limited Aid to Families with Dependent Children Benefits, referred to in this Part as the "commission," is
26	established.
28	Sec. 2. Commission membership. The commission consists of 9 members as follows:
30	1. Five members appointed by the Governor. The Governor
32	shall appoint one member from this group to serve as chair of the commission;
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36	2. Two members appointed by the President of the Senate; and
38	3. Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
40	Appointments must be made within 30 days of the effective date of this Part.

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SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 548, L.D. 1496

Sec. 3. Duties. The chair of the commission shall convene the first meeting no later than December 1, 1995. The commission shall study all issues related to Aid to Families with Dependent Children time limits in the State, including, but not limited to:

 Evaluation of other states' waivers and program design on time-limited benefits and the impacts on the Aid to Families with Dependent Children population, other public and private systems, the labor market and the states' economies;

Analysis of the Aid to Families with Dependent Children
caseload in the State, by time, deprivation reasons and the issues that increase reliance on Aid to Families with Dependent
Children benefits such as, but not limited to, vocational dysfunction, labor market declines, health care systems, economic
support networks such as unemployment compensation, child support enforcement, housing subsidy and workers' compensation; and

3. Research the impact on the State's economy if Aid to 20 Families with Dependent Children benefits were time-limited.

Sec. 4. Freedom of access; confidential information. Meetings of the commission are public meetings and records and papers of the commission are public records for the purposes of the freedom of access laws, pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 1, chapter 13, subchapter I; except that information obtained about individual Aid to Families with Dependent Children cases will remain confidential in accordance with rules of the Department of Human Services.

Sec. 5. Staffing. The Department of Human Services shall provide staffing and may, within existing resources, obtain technical assistance by organizations with expertise in economics, business, job creation and welfare-to-work programs.

36 Sec. 6. Compensation; reimbursement. The members of the commission are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement for 38 expenses related to attendance at meetings of the commission.

40 Sec. 7. Report. The commission shall submit its report and recommendations regarding time-limited Aid to Families with
42 Dependent Children benefits to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over human resources matters
44 no later than February 1, 1996. The committee may submit legislation relating to the report to the Second Regular Session
46 of the 117th Legislature.'
