Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

## **'FISCAL NOTE**

The Board of Licensure in Medicine and the Board of Osteopathic Licensure will incur some minor additional costs to administer certain responsibilities pertaining to the status of medical students. These costs can be absorbed within the boards' existing budgeted resources.'

## **STATEMENT OF FACT**

16 Currently, applicants for licensure as a medical doctor must have completed 24 months in a graduate educational program after
18 medical school. Applicants for a licensure as a doctor of osteopathy must have completed 12 months of hospital internship.
20 Medical doctor applicants who are graduates of a medical school may receive temporary educational certificates to act as interns
22 and residents. The certificate grants the medical doctor applicant the rights of a medical doctor.

The original bill allowed an applicant for licensure as a medical doctor who is in the last year of medical school and who is enrolled in a joint medical and graduate education program to receive a temporary certificate as a resident.

30 This amendment makes the same provision for applicants for a license as a doctor of osteopathy that the bill makes for 32 applicants for a license as a medical doctor.
