Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 14 MRSA c. 13 is enacted to read:
CHAPTER 13
SUNSHINE IN LITIGATION
§271. Short title
This chapter is known and may be cited as the "Sunshine in Litigation Act."
§272. Public hazard; defined
As used in this chapter, the term "public hazard" means a device, instrument, person, procedure, product or condition that has caused or is likely to cause injury.
§273. Concealing a public hazard
Except pursuant to this chapter, a court may not enter an order or approve an agreement that has the purpose or effect of
concealing a public hazard or any information that may be useful to members of the public in protecting themselves from injury that may result from the public hazard, including:
1. Evidence. Evidence of other similar injuries, illnesses or legal claims;
2. Research findings. Records of research findings documenting potential public health hazards;
3. Internal documents. Internal company documents concerning potential public hazards; and
4. Governmental records. Records filed with a governmental
agency.
§274. Agreements void
Any portion of an agreement or order that has the effect of concealing a public hazard is void, contrary to public policy and
unenforceable.
§275. Protection of trade secrets
Trade secrets, as defined in Title 10, section 1542, subsection 4, that are not pertinent to the public hazard are
protected pursuant to Title 10, chapter 302.

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§276. Standing; procedure

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	Any substantially affected person, including but not limited
4	to representatives of the news media, has standing to contest an
	<u>order or an agreement that violates this chapter, and may either</u>
6	intervene in the suit in which the order is entered or bring a
	declaratory judgment action pursuant to chapter 707. For good
8	cause shown, the court may conduct its review of the information
	<u>by means of an in camera inspection.</u>

	§277. Determination by court

	The court shall order the disclosure of information
14	concerning a public hazard or information that may be useful to
	the members of the public in protecting themselves from injury
16	that may result from a public hazard. The court may allow
	disclosure of only that portion of the information or materials
18	necessary or useful to the public regarding the public hazard.
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	STATEMENT OF FACT
22	
	The purpose of this bill is to aid consumers of the State in
24	obtaining information necessary to protect public health and
26	safety. This bill prohibits courts from entering orders or
20	approving agreements that conceal public hazards.
