Resolve, to Create an Advisory Commission to Review Long-term Liquor Policies and Pricing.

Presented by Representative ADAMS of Portland. Cosponsored by Representatives: CHIZMAR of Lisbon, FISHER of Brewer, NADEAU of Saco, Senator: STEVENS of Androscoggin. Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Advisory Commission to Review Long-term Liquor Policies and Pricing, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Members. Resolved: That the commission consists of 6 6 members as follows: one Senator, appointed by the President of the Senate; one Representative, appointed by the Speaker of the 8 House of Representatives; one member of the general public who is a Maine resident, appointed by the Governor; one member of the 10 State Liquor Commission, appointed by the chair of the State Liquor Commission; one member of the Maine Beer and Wine 12 Wholesalers Association, appointed by the Executive Director of 14 the Maine Beer and Wine Wholesalers Association; and one representative of agency liquor stores, appointed by the Maine Grocers Association; and be it further 16

18 Sec. 3. Organizational meeting. Resolved: That the commission shall hold an organizational meeting, called by the Chair of the 20 Legislative Council, within 30 days of the effective date of this resolve and shall elect from among the members a chair and a 22 vice-chair for the commission; and be it further

24 Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall investigate the issues of revenues lost to New Hampshire from the 26 sale of liquor and how the State may best recover those revenues by considering areas, including, but not limited to, the 28 following:

- 30 1. Enforcement of liquor laws;
- 32 2. Discount state liquor stores;
- 34 3. Locations of liquor stores; and
- 36 4. Pricing.
- 38 The commission must conduct at least one public hearing consistent with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act; and be it 40 further

42 Sec. 5. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall prepare a report and proposed legislation as to how the State may best 44 recover revenues lost to New Hampshire from the sale of liquor. This report and proposed legislation must be submitted to the 46 joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over matters involving alcohol by December 31, 1995; and be it 48 further

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the State Liquor Commission shall provide research, clerical 2 and computer assistance to the commission; and be it further 4 Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the commission are not entitled to compensation; and be it further 6 Sec. 8. Restriction. Resolved: That until the commission 8 submits its final report and proposed legislation, the State Liquor Commission may not authorize the establishment of any 10 discount state liquor stores. 12 14 STATEMENT OF FACT 16 This resolve creates an advisory commission to review
