20	Act Requiring Doctors of Naturopathic Medicine to Be Licensed by the Naturopathic Board of Examiners and Regulating Naturopathic
22	Health Care Practice"
24	Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:
26	'Resolve, Requiring a Study of How the State Should Regulate
28	Naturopaths'
30	Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place
32	the following:
34	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after
36	adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
38	Whereas, unregulated practitioners currently practice naturopathy in the State; and
40	Whoreas upgualified and incorretant practitionans par
42	Whereas, unqualified and incompetent practitioners may discourage the public from seeking treatment from qualified and competent health care providers; and
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46	Whereas, the citizens of this State currently have little guidance in determining the credentials of practitioners of naturopathy; and
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50	Whereas, the law in this State currently prohibits naturopaths from performing all those functions for which they consider themselves qualified; and
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Whereas, this may limit access of consumers in this State to 2 this profession; and

4 Whereas, the issues to be resolved to determine what the scope of practice should be involve many interest groups and are 6 technically complex; and

8 Whereas, to adequately study these issues prior to the next legislative session requires that this resolve be passed as 10 emergency legislation; and

12 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 14 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 16 safety; now, therefore, be it

 18 Sec. 1. Creation and charge. Resolved: That the Task Force on Naturopathy, referred to in this resolve as the "task force," is
 20 established and charged with determining the method by which the State should license naturopaths and making recommendations to
 22 the Legislature; and be it further

24 Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the task force consists of 9 members as follows:

One person with expertise in health care public policy,
 appointed by the Governor;

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30 2. One person with expertise in health care education, appointed by the Governor;

 One medical doctor, appointed by the Governor from
 recommendations submitted by the Board of Registration in Medicine;

One doctor of osteopathy, appointed by the Governor from
 recommendations submitted by the Board of Osteopathic Licensure;

Two naturopaths, appointed by the Governor from recommendations submitted by the Maine Association for
 Naturopathic Physicians;

44 6. The Director of the Bureau of Health in the Department of Human Services or the director's designee;

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7. The Commissioner of Professional and Financial
48 Regulation or the commissioner's designee with the ability to speak for the department in terms of departmental policy; and
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8. One consumer of naturopathic services who has no family relationship to a naturopathic practitioner, to be appointed by the Governor.

All appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. 6 The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the 8 making Legislative Council upon their appointments. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall contact 10 appointing authorities who have not made their appointments as of the required date; and be it further

Sec. 3. **Convening.** Resolved: That the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call the task force together for its 14 first meeting no later than 15 days after adjournment of the first regular session of the 117th Legislature. If the first 16 meeting is not called within the assigned time, the Governor 18 shall call the first meeting for a date no later than 10 days after the initially required date. It is not necessary for all members to be appointed in order for the task force to meet. A 20 quorum consists of a majority of those appointed; and be it 22 further

24 Sec. 4. Chair. Resolved: That the task force shall select a chair from among the members at the first meeting; and be it further

Sec. 5. Study subjects. Resolved: That the task force shall study how the State should regulate naturopathic practitioners.
 In conducting its work, the task force shall include, but is not limited to, the following issues:

The method of regulation, including practice license,
 title license, certification and registration;

36 2. The regulatory and oversight bodies;

38 3. The scope of practice, including, but not limited to, the following:

A. Natural childbirth;

B. Diagnostic procedures;

C. Prescription and administration of medicines and therapies, including natural antibiotics;

48 D. Surgical procedures; and

50 E. Acupuncture;

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4. The authorized professional title, for example, "doctor" or "physician" and use of the term "medical";

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5. Qualifications for licensure or certification;

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6. Grandfathering of current practitioners;

7. Practice by out-of-state licensees;

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8. The grounds for refusing to license, certify or register;

9. Continuing education requirements and the means of ensuring continuing competence; and

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10. Reciprocity with other states.

18 The task force shall provide specific answers to these issues. The task force may not leave any of these issues to the determination of the regulatory board. 20 In arriving at its answers, the task force shall review the answers to the sunrise 22 questions provided to the Joint Standing Committee on Business and Economic Development by the naturopathic practitioners who 24 supported the licensure before that committee. The task force shall also prepare its own answers to the sunrise questions required by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12015, 26 subsection 3, taking into consideration the answers submitted by the naturopathic practitioners. 28

In examining these issues, the task force may hold 5 meetings, including the initial organizational meeting. The task
 force shall hold its last meeting no later than November 15, 1995; and be it further

Sec. 6. Staffing. Resolved: That the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation shall provide staffing to the task force from existing departmental personnel; and be it further

40 Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That members are not entitled to compensation; and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That no later than December 15,
1995, the task force shall submit a written report together with recommended legislation to the Joint Standing Committee on
Business and Economic Development with a copy to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council and the Law and Legislative
Reference Library. The task force shall make an oral report to the Joint Standing Committee on Business and Economic Development
no later than January 30, 1996. The Joint Standing Committee on

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Business and Economic Development may submit legislation based on the recommendations of the task force.

4 The task force may take additional time to complete its study beyond the dates specified in this section if necessitated 6 by a failure of the task force to hold its first meeting on the date specified in this resolve.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the 10 preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.'

12 Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

18 The Department of Professional and Financial Regulation and the Department of Human Services will incur some minor additional costs to participate on the Task Force on Naturopathy. These costs can be absorbed within the departments' existing budgeted 22 resources.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

The bill required that naturopaths be licensed. This amendment replaces the bill and creates a task force to study the issue of how naturopaths should be licensed. The task force is composed of 2 physicians, 2 naturopaths, 1 expert in health care policy, 1 expert in health care education, the Director of the Bureau of Health, a representative of the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation and a consumer.

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This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
