9. Reports. No later than August 1st of each year, the board shall submit to the commissioner a report of its transactions in the preceding fiscal year ending June 30th and shall transmit to the commissioner a complete statement of all the receipts and expenditures of the board, attested by affidavits of the board's chair and secretary.

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10. Staff. The commissioner, to the extent possible and
 reasonable, shall make available to the board such staff,
 facilities, equipment, supplies, information and other assistance
 as the board may reasonably require to carry out its activities.
 The commissioner may also appoint, subject to the Civil Service
 Law, the employees necessary to carry out this section. Any
 person so employed must be located in the department and under
 the administrative and supervisory direction of the commissioner.

The commissioner <u>Board of Licensure of Water Treatment Plant</u> 28 <u>Operators</u> shall issue biennial licenses to individuals to act as operators. #### §2626. License from outside the State 4

The commissioner Board of Licensure of Water Treatment Plant 6 Operators, upon application therefor for licensure, may issue a license without examination, in a comparable classification, to 8 any person who holds a license in any state, territory or possession of the United States or any country, providing the 10 requirements for licensure of operators under which the person's license was issued does not conflict with this chapter and, in 12 the opinion of the commissioner, with the -advice -of -the board, 14 are of a standard not lower than that specified by regulations adopted under this chapter.

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### §2628. Rules

The commissioner, -- with - the - advice -- of - the -- board Board of Licensure of Water Treatment Plant Operators, in accordance with 20 any other appropriate state laws, shall make such rules as are 22 reasonably necessary to carry out the intent of this subchapter. The rules shall must include, but are not limited to, provisions establishing requirements for licensure and procedures for 24 examination of candidates and such other provisions as are 26 necessary for the administration of this subchapter.

28 §2629. Fees

30 The application fees, biennial renewal fees and reinstatement fees shall must be established by the commissioner Board of Licensure of Water Treatment Plant Operators by rule and 32 shall must be based upon different classifications of water 34 treatment systems and the levels of competence to operate various water systems. The-application-fee-shall-not-exceed -\$35,-and-the biennial-renewal-fee-shall not exceed-\$30. Revenues derived from 36 applicants failing the examination shall must be retained.

Sec. 9. Study. The Board of Licensure of Water Treatment Plant Operators shall conduct a study of the need for licensure 50

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of backflow prevention device testers and, if the board considers
necessary, determine what standards for licensure would be appropriate. The results of this study must be communicated to
the Commissioner of Human Services no later than June 1, 1996. In conducting this study, the board may hold any public hearings
or seek any public comment as it considers necessary.

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

In light of recent expansions in the requirements of the 12 laws governing safe drinking water, this bill establishes the Board of Licensure of Water Treatment Plant Operators within the 14 Department of Human Services. The primary purpose of the board is to provide expert support and direction within the department for the examination and licensure of water treatment plant 16 Specific fees and licensure standards operators. must be established by rule of the board. 18 Funding for the board is expected through to come from fees generated license 20 applications, renewals and reinstatements. The fees must be deposited in a nonlapsing account dedicated to the board. The 22 board is also commissioned to study the necessity of licensing testers of backflow prevention devices.
