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Further amend the bill in Part C by striking out all of section 9 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. C-9. 7 MRSA §1, as amended by PL 1991, c. 837, Pt. A, 28 \$12, is further amended to read:

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§1. Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources

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The Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources, is established and is maintained for the improvement of agriculture and the advancement of the interests of husbandry. Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources is referred to in this Title as the "department" and consists of the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources, in this Title called the "commissioner," and the following: The Aroostook Water and Soil Management Board, the Board of Pesticide Control, the Maine Dairy and Nutrition Council Committee, the Maine Dairy Promotion Board, the Maine Milk Commission, the Maine Potato the Seed Potato Board, the State Soil and Water Conservation Commission, the Harness Racing Commission, and the Board of Veterinary Medicine and-the-Animal-Welfare-Beard. commissioner is appointed by the Governor, subject to review by joint standing committee of the Legislature jurisdiction over agriculture matters and to confirmation by the Legislature, and holds office during the pleasure of the
