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PART E

14 Part E reduces the number of regional service delivery areas in the Department of Human Services from 5 to 3.

Part E changes the Division of Public Health Nursing to the 18 Public Health Nursing Program.

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Part E repeals the Division of Dental Health.

 Part E combines the Office of Child Care Coordination with Head Start and creates a new office called the Office of Child
 Care and Head Start. Part E also transfers the Office of Child Care and Head Start from the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Child
 and Family Services to the Division of Purchased and Support Services.

PART F

Part F combines the Bureau of Public Lands and Bureau of 32 Parks and Recreation within the Department of Conservation into a single agency, the Bureau of Parks and Lands.

This part clarifies that it is the intent to maintain the 36 unique status of parks, historic sites and public reserved lands. This part grants no new powers to the Bureau of Parks and Lands not already granted in statute to the 2 former bureaus, nor 38 it transfer the powers, duties and responsibilities does pertaining to any one class of land under existing statute to any 40 other class of land now under the purview of the new bureau. Since the combination of the 2 bureaus involves several chapters 42 of law, the current statutes will have to be reviewed for the consistency and incorporated into a new, unified chapter. The 44 unified chapter will preserve the mission of the former agencies and maintain the unique character of the different types of 46 state-owned land managed by the new agency.

This part also clarifies that the Director of the Bureau of Parks and Lands will continue to receive all revenue generated by

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sales or other activities on public lands and that this revenue remains distinct from revenues received from parks and historic sites.

The provisions of the former Bureau of Public Lands 6 pertaining to trespass and public access continue to apply only to public lands.

This part establishes that the funds dedicated to management of public lands remain dedicated to the management of those lands, which for the purpose of distinguishing them from other public lands have been more clearly defined as nonreserved public lands.

Reference to the Bureau of Parks and Recreation as an agency 16 that cooperates with the commissioner in compiling and maintaining the inventory of public reserved lands is eliminated.

Procedures for land acquisition by eminent domain are 20 specific only to lands designated as parks or historic sites.

This part also establishes the Bureau of Parks and Lands within the Department of Conservation, defines the deputy
director position, and specifies that the deputy director is appointed by the commissioner.

This part also combines the Maine Geological Survey and the 28 Natural Areas Program into a single unit, the Natural Resources Information and Mapping Center, and provides a a revision clause 30 and transition provisions.

34 Part G makes the following changes to laws affecting the Department of Corrections.

PART G

 Part G requires a court to make a determination,
 whenever a juvenile is committed to the Maine Youth Center or put on probation with a condition of out-of-home placement, as to
 whether reasonable efforts have been made to prevent or eliminate the need for removal of the juvenile from the juvenile's home and
 as to whether continuation in the home is contrary to the welfare of the juvenile. The court must review this determination at
 least once every 18 months until the juvenile is discharged.

2. Part G requires a court to order a parent or guardian of
 a juvenile committed to the Maine Youth Center or to the
 Department of Human Services or placed on probation to pay for
 medical and other treatment provided to the juvenile except in a

case of excessive hardship, in which case the court must order a
 reasonable amount paid toward the cost of treatment.

3. Part G abolishes the Division of Probation and Parole within the Department of Corrections and the position of Director
of Probation and Parole and assigns certain probation and parole responsibilities to the Commissioner of Corrections and the
Associate Commissioners of Corrections.

10 Part G clarifies the administrative structure at the 4. associate commissioner level by identifying one Associate 12 Commissioner of Corrections responsible for adult services and Commissioner of Corrections responsible one Associate for juvenile services. The Director of Correctional 14 Programs position is retitled to Director of Policy, Legislative and 16 Information Services.

18 5. Part G requires a client participating in a halfway house program who is also permitted to participate in a work
 20 release program to pay the costs of board and the costs of transportation if arranged by the halfway house. Funds received
 22 from a client for these costs must be placed in the General Fund.

24 6. Part G provides among the purposes of the Maine Youth Center the protection of the public from dangerous juveniles.

 Part G authorizes the Governor or the Governor's
 designee to order that personnel and equipment of the state military forces be employed to design and construct a security
 fence around the Maine Youth Center.

Part H requires the Governor, when submitting the budget, to identify the positions that are authorized for less than 52 weeks
as "Positions - Full-time Equivalent" and positions that are authorized for 52 weeks as "Positions - Legislative Count."

Part H eliminates the Public Health Nurse I position that 40 provided services to the State House complex for state employees and State House visitors. Part H also amends Public Law 1995, 42 chapter 368, Part A, section 15 by transferring the State Cost Allocation program from the Bureau of the Budget to the Division 44 of Financial and Personnel Services within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services.
