HOUSE AMENDMENT "F" to H.P. 1150, L.D. 1589, Bill, "An Act to Implement the Recommendations of the Productivity Realization Task Force"

Amend the bill by inserting at the end before the emergency clause the following:

PART M

Sec. M-1. Governor Baxter School for the Deaf. In making the recommendations required by Public Law 1995, chapter 99, the Productivity Realization Task Force or the Governor may not include among recommendations any additional budget reductions or the elimination of any program in the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf until March 1, 1996.'

Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

FISCAL NOTE

This amendment may affect the ability of the Productivity Realization Task Force to realize the level of savings established in Public Law 1995, chapter 368.
