10	Part A of this bill makes 'General Fund appropriations, Fede	~	

Part A of this bill makes "non-productivity" adjustments to General Fund appropriations, Federal Expenditure Fund allocations and Other Special Revenue allocations in the Department of Human Services.

Part B authorizes the Department of Human Services to pay the legal services for individuals appealing denial of Federal Supplemental Security Income benefits in order to reduce expenditure of General Assistance and Aid to Families with Dependent Children funds. Part B also provides that funds deappropriated from the General Fund may not be transferred or utilized for any other purpose unless appropriated by the Legislature.
