This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Legal and Veterans' Affairs. The bill allows brewers and other certificate of approval holders to form a limited partnership. This amendment provides that a brewer or other certificate of approval holder is prohibited from participating in a limited partnership with a wholesale licensee for longer than 8 years.
