An Act to Allow the Diagnosis of Biologically-based Mental Illness by Licensed Psychologists.

(EMERGENCY)

Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 26. Received by the Secretary of the Senate on December 20, 1995. Referred to the Committee on Banking and Insurance and ordered printed pursuant to Joint Rule 14.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, under current law, provisions governing insurance coverage for biologically-based mental illnesses are scheduled to take effect July 1, 1996; and

Whereas, the provisions authorize the diagnosis of these 10 mental illnesses only by licensed allopathic or osteopathic physicians; and

Whereas, in current practice, many of these diagnoses are 14 made by psychologists at the request of physicians; and

16 . Whereas, this legislation authorizes the diagnosis of biologically-based mental illnesses by licensed psychologists; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
safety; now, therefore,

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
