SENATE AMENDMENT " B " to S.P. 624, L.D. 1632, Bill, "An Act Relating to the Sale of Alcoholic Beverages"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 1 in the 3rd line from the end (page 1, line 12 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "licensees" the following: 'if the depletion allowance is posted in accordance with section 1408'

Further amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated "§708-A." in the first paragraph in the last line (page 1, line 23 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "beverages" the following: ', if that offer is not contingent on the purchase of an alcoholic beverage'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment clarifies that depletion allowances are permissible if they are posted in accordance with existing price-posting requirements. It also provides that in-pack games, contests and sweepstakes are permitted if a consumer is not required to purchase an alcoholic beverage in order to participate in the game, contest or sweepstakes.
