30	STATEMENT OF FACT
32	This amendment clarifies that depletion allowances are permissible if they are posted in accordance with existing
34	price-posting requirements. It also provides that in-pack games, contests and sweepstakes are permitted if a consumer is not
36	required to purchase an alcoholic beverage in order to participate in the game, contest or sweepstakes.
