An Act to Amend the Charter of the Boothbay Harbor Water District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1895, c. 56, §2, as amended by P&SL 1993, c. 38, §1, is further amended to read:

Sec. 2. Authority to convey and sell and purify water; authority to convey wastewater; territory. The town is further authorized and empowered, -in-case-it-obtains-control-of-the-corporation-either directly-by-purchase, -or-indirectly-through-ownership-of-stock, to take water from Adams pond in the town of Boothbay or from any other ponds or supply in the tewns-of--Boothbay, Boothbay Harbor and -- Southport Water System Service Area, sufficient for all domestic, sanitary, municipal and commercial purposes, to perform such operations and procedures as may be necessary to ensure the purity of any water so taken, including constructing operating water treatment and purification facilities, and to take and convey the same, through the tewns-ef-Beethbay, Boothbay Harbor, - Southport - and -to - Squirrel - Island, - Mouse - Island - and - other adjacent--islands Water System Service Area. The town, acting through its Board of Water Commissioners, is also authorized and empowered, to sell water to the towns of Boothbay and-Southport, to-the-Village Corporation of Squirrel-Island Harbor Water System Service Area and to any company, individual, firm or corporation in the towns of Boothbay, Boothbay Harbor and Southport. town is also authorized to convey through the towns of Boothbay, Boothbay Harbor and Southport such wastewater as may be produced operation of any water treatment or purification facility. The Boothbay Harbor Water System Service Area includes the area bounded and described as follows:

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That part of the town of Boothbay commencing on the boundary line between Boothbay and Boothbay Harbor at a distance westerly along said line of 2,000 feet from the center line of the Beath Road, thence continuing in a northerly direction to the intersection of the Beath Road with the road passing by the Country Club, which intersection is known as Houlton's Corner, thence continuing in a northeasterly direction along the center line of Butler Road to the intersection of Butler Road with Pleasant Cove and Pension Ridge Road, thence continuing in a northerly direction along the center line of Pension Ridge Road to the intersection of Pension Ridge Road with Ambleside Road, thence continuing in a northeasterly direction along the center of Ambleside Road to the end of Ambleside Road, thence continuing in a straight line further in a northeasterly direction through Pleasant Cove to the southwest point in the angle of the boundary line between Boothbay and Bristol at the end of Pleasant Cove, thence continuing in a generally northerly, westerly, southerly, and easterly direction along the boundary line of Boothbay and Bristol and Boothbay and Edgecomb and Boothbay and Westport and Boothbay and Boothbay Harbor to the point of beginning.

The Boothbay Harbor Water System Service Area also includes the towns of Boothbay Harbor and Southport. The Boothbay Harbor

Water System has the exclusive authority to provide services to the areas described in this section, but not to Southport. The Boothbay Harbor Water System Service Area also includes the Village Corporation of Squirrel Island, Mouse Island and other adjacent islands, but the Boothbay Harbor Water System does not have exclusive authority to provide services to these areas.

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Sec. 2. P&SL 1895, c. 56, §4 is amended to read:

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Sec. 4. Fill plan of location in registry of deeds; file statement of damages. Said The town shall file in the registry of deeds for the county of Lincoln, plans and description of the location of all the lands and water rights taken under the provisions of this act, and me entry shall may not be made upon any land, except to make surveys, until the expiration of ten 10 days from such the filing, and with such the plan said the town may file a statement of the damages it is willing to pay to any person for any property or property rights so taken; and if the amount finally awarded does not exceed that sum, the town shall recover costs against said a person, otherwise such that person shall recover costs against said the town. Within thirty 30 days after the filing of said the plans and description, the town shall publish notice of such the taking and filing, in some a newspaper in said the county, such the publication to be continued three 3 weeks successively.

Sec. 3. P&SL 1895, c. 56, §§5 and 6 are amended to read:

Sec. 5. Liable for all damages; damages, how ascertained in case of disagreement. Said The town shall must be held liable to pay all legal damages that shall-be are sustained by any person by the taking of his that person's land, water rights or other property, or by flowage, or by excavating through any land for the purpose of laying down pipes and aqueducts, building dams and reservoirs; and if any person sustaining damages as-aforesaid and said the town are unable to agree upon the sum to be paid therefor for the damages, such the persons, or said the town may, within twelve 12 months after the filing of said the plans and location, apply to the commissioners of the county of Lincoln who shall eause-such have the damages te-be assessed in the same manner and under the same conditions, restrictions, limitations and rights of appeal as are by law prescribed in the case of damages for the laying out of highways, so far as such the law is consistent with the provisions of this act. A The failure to make such an application within said---twelve <u>12</u> months shall---be

held is deemed to be a waiver of all rights to claim damages therefor.

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- Sec. 6. Authorized to make contract with any water company, for sale or lease of any system of work. Said The town is further authorized and empowered to enter into contracts with any duly organized water company, for the sale or lease to said the water company of any system of water works owned by said the town, on such terms and subject to such conditions as a majority of the voters of said the town at a legal meeting called therefor for that purpose may prescribe.
- Sec. 4. P&SL 1895, c. 56, §7, as amended by P&SL 1993, c. 38, 14 §3, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
- 16 Sec. 7. Board of water commissioners; duties; compensation; town manager, powers and duties. The town may elect by ballot a board of 18 water commissioners consisting of 3 persons, the first 3 chosen to serve one for one year, one for 2 years and one for 3 years 20 and, after the initial election, one commissioner is elected annually in the month of May to serve a term of 3 years. The water commissioner who receives the largest number of votes cast 22 at the first election shall hold office for 3 years. The water 24 commissioner who receives the next largest number of votes cast at the first election shall hold office for 2 years and the water 26 commissioner who receives the next largest number of votes cast at the first election shall hold office for one year. The water 28 commissioners shall serve until their successors are elected and qualified. If a commissioner resigns from office before the expiration of the commissioner's term or is otherwise unable to 30 complete the term, the remaining 2 commissioners may appoint a new commissioner to complete the term of the departed 32 commissioner. The 2 remaining commissioners must agree on the 34 appointment in order to exercise their appointment authority. The commissioners may fix water rates and determine the 36 conditions and manner of the water supply and have general control and management of the water system owned by the town. 38 The commissioners are entitled to receive such compensation for their services as may be fixed by the town. When the town votes 40 to employ a town manager, but not in union with one or more other towns, the town manager is the administrative head of the water 42 system and responsible to the water commissioners. The town manager's powers and duties in connection with the water system 44 are the same as in the management of the municipal affairs of the town, so far as applicable. Purchases and disbursements are made 46 by the town manager on vouchers signed by a majority of the water commissioners.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill amends the charter of the Town of Boothbay Harbor Water System. This bill clarifies that the service area of the Boothbay Harbor Water System includes territory also served by the East Boothbay Water District. This bill also grants to the Boothbay Harbor Water System the exclusive authority to provide water services to portions of Boothbay and all of Boothbay Harbor and Southport, and the nonexclusive authority to provide water services to Squirrel Island, Mouse Island and other adjacent islands.
