HOUSE AMENDMENT "<sup>b</sup>" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1195, L.D. 1639, Bill, "An Act to Amend Certain Motor Vehicle Laws Including Those Affecting the University of Maine System Plate and the Certificate of Lien"

Amend the amendment in Part B by inserting before section 1 the following:

**Sec. B-1. 5 MRSA §88-A, sub-§1**, as amended by PL 1993, c. 658, §1, is further amended to read:

**1. Application.** Any person ~~18~~ 15 years of age or over who is a Maine resident or a nonresident temporarily domiciled in the State with a mailing address in the State may apply for an official state nondriver identification card. The application must be on a form provided by the Secretary of State and include any supporting documents and information required by the Secretary of State.

A. The application form must include, directly above the signature line, the following notice to the applicant: "I understand that knowingly supplying false information on this form is a Class D crime under Title 17-A, punishable by confinement of up to 364 days or by monetary fine of up to \$1,000, or both."

**Sec. B-2. 5 MRSA §88-A, sub-§2**, as amended by PL 1995, c. 65, Pt. A, §7 and affected by §153 and Pt. C, §15, is further amended to read:

**2. Issuance of card; contents.** Upon receipt of a completed application and payment of a fee of \$5, the Secretary of State

2 shall issue an identification card to the applicant. If a person  
3 is the holder of a motor vehicle operator's license bearing a  
4 photograph of the individual and issued under Title 29-A, chapter  
5 11, the Secretary of State or the Secretary of State's  
6 representative may refuse to issue an identification card. The  
7 Secretary of State shall design cards for persons 18 15 to 21  
8 years of age so that they are readily distinguishable from cards  
for persons 21 years of age or older. Each card must contain:

- 10 A. The applicant's photograph;
- 12 B. The applicant's name and address;
- 14 C. The applicant's date of birth; and
- 16 D. Any other information and identification that the

18 Further amend the amendment in Part B in section 22 in the  
20 4th line from the end (page 12, line 3 in amendment) by inserting  
21 after the following: "amend" the following: 'Title 5, section  
22 88-A, subsections 1 and 2 and'

Highway Fund \$46,435

The fees collected from the additional official state nondriver identification cards issued as a result of this amendment will increase Highway Fund revenue by \$46,435 in fiscal year 1996-97. This amendment also includes a Highway Fund allocation of \$7,662 in fiscal year 1996-97 for the Bureau of Motor Vehicles within the Department of the Secretary of State to provide funds for the costs of producing the additional cards. The amounts of the additional Highway Fund revenue and costs associated with these identification cards beginning in fiscal year 1997-98 will be less than the amounts above. The amounts can not be estimated at this time.

**STATEMENT OF FACT**

This amendment allows for the issuance of official state nondriver identification cards to persons 15, 16 and 17 years of age beginning July 1, 1996. The card is currently issued to persons 18, 19 and 20 years of age and is distinguishable from cards for persons 21 years of age or older.
