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Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §1661-A, as amended by PL 1995, c. 65, Pt. A, §23 and affected by §153 and Pt. C, §15, is further amended to read:

## §1661-A. Gasoline stations to provide services for handicapped drivers

Every full-service gasoline station offering self-service pumping at a lesser cost shall require an attendant employed by the station to dispense gasoline to any motor vehicle properly displaying a handicapped placard or special designating plates issued under Title 29-A, section 521, when the person to whom the placard or plates have been issued is the operator of the vehicle, the service is requested, the operator has a driver's license designated with a code H- S, restricted to special

18 equipment, and there is no nonhandicapped adult in the motor vehicle.

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### STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill eliminates language that limits the number of characters permissible on the University of Maine System registration. This language is misleading since plate design only allows for a maximum of 5 characters. This bill also makes the fees associated with the University of Maine System plates

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4	This bill repeals language that allowed a registrant to retain an existing plate number for use on an antique vehicle.
6	This bill also repeals the requirement that persons with a disability have their name on the registration placard.
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10	This bill also allows the Secretary of State to eliminate the certificate of lien document and allows the certificate of title to act as both prima facie evidence of ownership and

14	This bill also requires a salvage vehicle repaired by the use of a front or rear clip to be designated as a rebuilt salvage
16	on the certificate of title.
18	This bill also requires a licensee's signature to be the same as the name displayed on the license.
