§1663. Sale of reformulated gasoline
This section governs the sale of reformulated gasoline.
1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless context otherwise indicates, the following terms have following meanings.
A. "Conventional gasoline" means nonreformulated gasoline
B. "Reformulated gasoline" means gasoline described Section 211(k) of the federal Clean Air Act, as amended, United States Code, Section 7545 (k).
2. Sale of reformulated gasoline. From May 15th September 15th annually, the sale or dispensing by any refine blender, importer or marketer of conventional gasoline for res
in the State is prohibited. A retail seller of fuel may contito sell reformulated gasoline to the ultimate consumer for
days after September 15th.
3. Sale of conventional gasoline. Except as provided subsection 2, a person may not sell or deliver for s
reformulated gasoline in this State unless that person prohibited by federal law from selling or delivering convention gasoline.
Sec. 2. Seasonal exemption from reformulated gasoline sales. Commissioner of Environmental Protection, within 30 days of
effective date of this Act, shall petition the United Sta
Environmental Protection Agency to remove all counties in State from the list of counties that must use reformula
gasoline for the 4 -month period beginning May 15th and end September 15th, annually.
Sec. 3. Effective date. Section 1 of this Act takes ef
September 15, 1996.
STATEMENT OF FACT
This bill prohibits the sale of reformulated gasoline in
State except during a 4-month period and unless the sale

- nonreformulated gasoline is prohibited by federal law. During the 4-month period, all service stations in the State are required to sell reformulated gasoline exclusively. This bill
- 4 also requires the Commissioner of Environmental Protection to petition the Administrator of the United States Environmental
- 6 Protection Agency to remove all Maine counties from the list of areas required to sell reformulated gasoline for the 4-month
- 8 period.
