An Act to Modify the Transfer Procedures for Appropriations, Allocations and Positions.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §1585, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1991, c. 9, Pt. E, §6, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

- 1. Transfer procedures. The balance of an appropriation or 6 allocation made by the Legislature for any department or agency of the State, which at the time may not be required for the 8 purpose named in those appropriations or allocations, may be transferred between line categories, accounts and departments 10 within the same fund in the department or agency for the same fiscal year subject to review by the joint standing committee of 12 the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs. Any position authorized by the Legislature 14 for a department or agency, which at the time may not be required for the purpose authorized by the Legislature, may be transferred 16 between accounts, departments and funds, subject to the limitations of this subsection and section 1583-A, for the same 18 fiscal year subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and 20 financial affairs. Those appropriation, allocation or position transfers must be authorized by the Governor on financial order 22 to achieve one or more of the following standards:
  - A. To improve the effectiveness with which appropriations or allocations available are spent within a fiscal year;
- B. To reduce the ratio of the management, administrative, clerical and supervisory personnel of a department or agency to the nonsupervisory personnel;
- 32 <u>C. To consolidate or restructure redundant State Government services, programs and operations, when possible;</u>
- D. To integrate the effective use of technology into departments, agencies, programs and operations of the State; or
- E. To achieve the most effective delivery of services to citizens of the State.
- Financial orders describing these transfers must be submitted by the Bureau of the Budget to the Office of Fiscal and Program Review 30 days before the transfer is to be implemented. In the case of extraordinary emergency transfers, the 30-day prior submission requirement may be waived by vote of the committee. Positions or funding for those positions, which are currently funded with federal or other funds, may not be transferred by financial order to the General Fund.

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Department and agency heads are authorized to transfer up to \$1,000 of All Other or Capital Expenditures appropriations or 2 allocations to a line category or account within the same fund in 4 the department or agency by notifying the State Budget Officer within 5 days of the action by means of a signed financial order. The State Budget Officer is authorized to transfer up to 6 \$10,000 of All Other or Capital Expenditures appropriations or allocations to a line category or account within the same fund in 8 the department or agency upon the receipt of a signed financial 10 order from the department or agency head. Department and agency heads may not intentionally split appropriation or allocation 12 transfers in order to be within the authorization limits of \$1,000 or \$10,000. Financial orders authorizing transfers of up 14 to \$10,000 of All Other or Capital Expenditures appropriations or allocations among line categories or accounts within the same fund and department or agency are not subject to the 30-day prior 16 approval requirement. Approved financial orders authorizing the 18 transfer of up to \$10,000 of All Other or Capital Expenditures appropriations or allocations to a line category or account 20 within the same fund in a department or agency must be submitted to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having 22 jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs.

### Sec. 2. PL 1995, c. 368, Pt. A, §§3 and 6 are repealed.

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#### STATEMENT OF FACT

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The bill changes the requirement of financial order approval for transfers of appropriations or allocations in amounts that do not represent a material threat to the financial integrity of State Government and in the inefficient use of financial resources. These proposals also recognize the need in State Government allow the transfer of appropriations allocations between line categories, accounts and departments within the same fund and to transfer positions between accounts and departments in order to take advantage of immediate opportunities for streamlining and improving State Government services.
