An Act to Permit Retired Marine Patrol Officers to Enter into Commercial Fishing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6025, sub-§6 is enacted to read:

6. Retired marine patrol officer; license. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a retired marine patrol officer may not be denied a license under this Part on the basis of a requirement that the officer possessed a license at some time in the past or on the basis that the officer owned and operated a boat or other equipment for the harvesting of a marine organism at some time in the past. An officer who is retired on the effective date of this subsection shall exercise the rights granted to that officer by this subsection no later than one year after the effective date of this subsection. An officer who retires after the effective date of this subsection no later than one year after than one year after that officer by this subsection no later than one year after that officer retires.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides that a retired marine patrol officer may not be denied a license under the marine resources laws on the basis of a requirement that the officer possessed a license at some time in the past or on the basis that the officer owned and operated a boat or other equipment for the harvesting of a marine organism at some time in the past.
