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search and rescue efforts initiated in support of the air search and rescue plan by the Maine Wing Civil Air Patrol and those state and federal agencies which that are designated in the plan to play an-assisting a role in emergencies.

A-1. The Chief of the State Police may delegate authority for overall coordination of air search and rescue efforts to a commissioned officer within the Bureau of State Police.

B----The--Director--of--the--Division--of--Aeronautics--shall communicate--and--coordinate--directly--with--the--Air--Search Mission-Coordinator,-an-official--of--the--Maine--Wing--Givil--Air Patrol,--who--is--involved--in-coordinating--and--controlling--the specific--air--search--operations--conducted--under--the--air search-and-rescue-plan.

C---The-Director-of-the-Division-of-Aeronautics-shall communicate-and-coordinate-with-state-agencies-who-have agreed--to--offer--mutual--support--in--implementing--the cooperative-action-plan-for-air-search-and-rescue,-when-the assistance-is-needed-in-searching-for-missing-persons--The director-shall--immediately--inform--the-Bureau--of--Marine Patrol-of-any-aircraft-that-is-believed-lost-over-coastal waters-of-the-State-and-keep-the-bureau-appraised-of-the progress-of-the-search-for-that-aircraft-

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The bill as amended makes the Chief of the State Police responsible for developing an air search and rescue plan and allows that plan to determine the notification system for and to specify the role of various agencies in air search and rescue operations.

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
