42	'FISCAL NOTE
44	This bill may increase prosecutions for Class E crimes. If
46	a jail sentence is imposed, the additional costs to the counties are estimated to be \$83.70 per day per prisoner. These costs are not reimbursed by the State. The number of prosecutions that may
48	result in a jail sentence and the resulting costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

8 The amendment changes the title to represent the intent of the bill, which is to create a crime, not a process for civil 10 recovery. The amendment also clarifies that the crime is one of strict liability.

The amendment makes a technical correction and adds a fiscal 14 note to the bill.

16 The Department of Corrections has prepared the following correctional impact statement pursuant to the Maine Revised
18 Statutes, Title 34-A, section 1402: "L.D. 1685, "An Act to Provide Recovery for Motor Vehicle Damage to Forest Lands" would
20 expand the use of an existing Class E penalties.

22 Sentences imposed for a Class E offense resulting in incarceration must be served in a county jail. The average cost 24 per sentence to the county for a Class E offense is \$5,608."
