The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the Act, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay, and the Act takes effect 30 days after the date of the proclamation.

The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this Act necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

FISCAL NOTE

The estimated cost of sending this Act out to referendum will vary according to the total number of referenda enacted during the Second Regular Session of the 117th Legislature to be submitted to the voters in November. The estimated cost to the Secretary of State if one to 6 referenda are enacted is \$95,000. Each additional referendum costs an additional \$7,000.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment is the minority report. It directs the Maine Turnpike Authority to proceed with all actions necessary to widen the turnpike from Exit 1 to Exit 6-A upon meeting the requirements of the Sensible Transportation Policy Act as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 23, section 1965-A and upon approval of the widening by the voters in a statewide referendum.

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
