E. The residential real estate up to the just value of \$4,000 of inhabitants of Maine who are legally blind as determined by the Department of Education, Division for the Blind and Visually Impaired a properly licensed Doctor of Medicine, Doctor of Osteopathy or Doctor of Optometry; and

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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Currently, the Director of the Division for the Blind is required to certify the legal blindness of applicants for a tax exemption. The bill amends the law to require that certification of an applicant as legally blind for a tax exemption be made by a Doctor of Medicine, Doctor of Osteopathy or Doctor of Optometry.
