	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
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6	Whereas, more than 38,000,000 pounds of sea urchins having a total landed value of nearly \$35,000,000 were harvested in
8	Maine's coastal waters during 1994; and
•	Whereas, sea urchins are among the 3 highest valued
10	fisheries in the State; and
12	Whereas, this pressure on the sea urchin resource is rapidly depleting the resource; and
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16	Whereas, the continuation of the sea urchin fishery depends on the maintenance of sustainable yields; and
18	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
	create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
20	Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and

By September 1, 1996, the commissioner shall establish
conservation beds in each zone established in section 6749-N.
Harvesting of sea urchins in the conservation beds is prohibited.
§6749-G. Yield requirements
A person who holds a wholesale seafood license with a sea
urchin processor's permit or a wholesale seafood license with a
sea urchin buyer's permit may not purchase, process, sell, ship
or transport outside the State any sea urchins with an average
<u>sea urchin roe yield of less than 10% per lot with a 2% tolerance</u>
by volume. The commissioner shall adopt regulations setting
forth a mechanism to measure roe yields.

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Notwithstanding section 6749, in calendar years 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002 and 2003, it is unlawful for a person to fish for or take sea urchins from:

1. Zone 1. Zone 1, from February 1st to July 31st. For the purposes of this article, "Zone 1" means all coastal waters west of a line beginning at the southernmost tip of Small Point then running due south magnetic to the boundary of the State's coastal waters:

2. Zone 2. Zone 2, from March 1st to August 31st. For the purposes of this article, "Zone 2" means all coastal waters in the area between the following 2 lines:

A. A line beginning at the southernmost tip of Small Point then running due south magnetic to the boundary of the State's coastal water; and

B. The Sea Urchin Research Fund, referred to in this article as the "fund," is established in <u>and is administered by</u> the department. Balances in the fund may not lapse and must be carried forward and used for the purposes of this section.

1. Uses of the fund. The commissioner shall use the fund for to develop resource protection measures, study the effectiveness of current resource protection measures, finance additional measures related to the sea urchin resource as determined necessary by the commissioner or conduct research directly related to sea urchin fishery management information needs. The purpose of that research directly related to sea urchin fishery management information must be to determine, with the highest reliability possible given available resources, the greatest level of effort that may be applied to the sea urchin fishery without harming the long-term economic and biological sustainability of the sea urchin fishery. The commissioner shall consider recommendations of the Sea Urchin Council when planning for fund expenditures.

	STATEMENT OF FACT
	This bill makes the following changes and additions to the
se	ea urchin laws.
	The bill creates the Sea Urchin Council to advise the ommissioner of Marine Resources the on use of the Sea Urchin esearch Fund. The bill also broadens the purposes for which the

fund may be used and allows the commissioner to use 1/2 of the fund's annual revenues to enforce sea urchin laws.

The bill increases the fines for 2nd and 3rd convictions of the sea urchin laws. The bill also requires a 10-day license suspension for a first conviction of the sea urchin laws; a one-year license suspension for a 2nd conviction of the sea urchin laws; and a lifetime license revocation for a 3rd conviction of the sea urchin laws.

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The bill prohibits dragging for sea urchins between May 1st and October 14th.

The bill increases the number of sea urchin harvesting zones from 2 to 4 and establishes closure times for each zone. The zone closures are as follows:

Zone 1 (western) February 1st - July 31st
Zone 2 (midwestern) March 1st - August 31st
Zone 3 (mideastern) April 1st - September 30th
Zone 4 (eastern) February 1st - July 31st

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Maine waters are closed to all sea urchin harvesting for 3 months, from May 1st to July 31st.

The bill allows sea urchin harvesters to fish in 2 adjacent zones.

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The bill prohibits sea urchin harvesting on Sundays during the months of August, September, October, February, March and April.

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The bill extends for 4 years certain emergency provisions relating to sea urchin harvesting and excludes from the repeal certain emergency provisions. All of the emergency provisions are currently scheduled to be repealed January 1, 1999. The bill extends the repeal date to January 1, 2004. The emergency provisions are the harvesting zones, limited entry, licensing by zone, license surcharges, the Sea Urchin Research Fund and log books. The bill excludes license surcharges, the Sea Urchin Research Fund and log books from the repeal date.

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The bill requires the commissioner to establish conservation beds in each zone. Sea urchin harvesting is prohibited in the beds at all times.

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The bill establishes a roe-yield content of 10% per lot, with a 2% tolerance by volume.

The bill allows the commissioner to annually issue a number of new sea urchin licenses that equals the difference between the number of licenses issued in the prior calendar year and the

number of licenses issued in 1994. The new licenses must be distributed equitably among the classes of handfishing, dragging and hand-raking and trapping licenses. The commissioner is required to establish a lottery system for awarding the new licenses.

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The bill also establishes specific log book requirements for holders of wholesale seafood licenses with a sea urchin processor's permit and for holders of wholesale seafood licenses with a sea urchin buyer's permit.
