Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

This bill allows municipalities, in response to a request, to release the name of a recipient of general assistance and the amount of any overpayment to that recipient if it has been determined that the recipient obtained assistance by serious, false misrepresentation and if a determination has been made that a recipient is required to reimburse the municipality.
