24	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the emergency clause and inserting in its place
26	the following:
28	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3174-I, sub-§1, ¶B-2 is enacted to read:
30	<u>B-2. The department shall establish additional assessment practices and related policies for persons with Alzheimer's</u>
32	disease and other dementias as follows,
34	(1) For persons who have been assessed using the department's primary assessment instrument and found to
36	have cognitive or behavioral difficulties but who do not require nursing intervention with the frequency
38	necessary to qualify for nursing facility level of care, the department shall administer a supplemental
40	dementia assessment for those persons with cognitive and behavioral impairments. By May 1, 1996, the
42	criteria reflected in this supplemental dementia assessment and the scoring mechanism must be
44	incorporated into rules adopted by the department in consultation with consumers, providers and other
46	interested parties. The assessment criteria proposed
48	in the rulemaking must consider, but are not limited to, the following: orientation, memory, receptive communication, expressive communication, wandering,
50	behavioral demands on others, danger to self or others
52	and awareness of needs.

(2) The department shall reimburse a nursing facility 2 for individuals who are eligible for care based on the supplemental dementia assessment only if the nursing 4 facility demonstrates a program of training in the care of persons with Alzheimer's disease and other dementias for all staff responsible for the care of persons with 6 these conditions. The department, in consultation with 8 consumers, providers and interested parties, shall develop the requirements for training and adopt rules 10 containing those requirements. By July 1, 1997, the department, in consultation with consumers, providers and interested parties, shall adopt rules establishing 12 the standards for treatments, services and settings to meet the needs of individuals who have Alzheimer's 14 disease and other dementias. COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 668, L.D. 1730

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill. It requires the 4 Department of Human Services to adopt rules to begin using a 2nd assessment standard for persons with Alzheimer's disease and 6 other dementias. The department will begin using these new assessment standards in addition to the MED'94 by May 1, 1996. 8 Nursing facilities accepting persons found eligible using this assessment tool will be required to train personnel in Alzheimer's disease and other dementias immediately in order to 10 qualify for reimbursement from the State. By July 1, 1997, the 12 department will adopt standards for treatments, services and settings to meet the needs of individuals who have Alzheimer's 14 disease and other dementias.

16 This amendment requires the Department of Human Services to report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having 18 jurisdiction over health and human service matters by January 15, 1997, on the extent to which the supplemental assessment tool 20 has expanded medical eligibility for nursing facility care to include persons with Alzheimer's disease or similar dementias.
