'Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §1043, sub-§11, ¶F, as amended by PL 1995, c. 2 204, §§1 and 2, is further amended by amending subparagraphs (32), (36) and (37) to read: 4 (32) After December 31, 1981, services performed by an 6 individual on a boat engaged in catching fish or other forms of aquatic animal life, unless those services would be included in the definition of "employment" for 8 federal unemployment tax purposes under the Federal 10 Unemployment Act, United States Code, Title 26, Section 3306(c), as it may be amended. exemption of certain persons employed as clam diggers and those persons employed as Maine guides from unemployment insurance requirements.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

8 This amendment replaces the original bill with a more limited exemption from the state unemployment insurance requirements. The amendment provides that services performed in harvesting shellfish for depuration from contaminated areas are not considered employment for the purposes of unemployment insurance taxes and benefit eligibility. The amendment also provides that services performed by a licensed guide are also exempt if that employment is exempt from the federal unemployment tax. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
