10	This bill includes a General Fund appropriation of \$165,000 in fiscal year 1996-97 to the Department of Mental Health, Mental
12	Retardation and Substance Abuse Services to support the unbudgeted increase in the cost of workers' compensation
14	insurance for certain agencies that provide services to people with mental retardation. The actual amount required may vary
16	from this estimate of the cost, depending on the actual experience of these agencies.'

20	SUMMARY
22	This amendment removes from the bill the provisions requiring the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and
24	Substance Abuse Services to ensure that private agencies providing mental retardation services under contract have loss
26	prevention programs in place. It removes the portion of the bill requiring a report on special classifications for workers'
28	compensation insurance. It adds reimbursement criteria that depend on an agency's workers' compensation experience
30	modification rating and that provide incentives to provide a safe workplace.

The amendment also adds an appropriation and a fiscal note.

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
