

12 A. The Secretary of State shall establish the Technical
13 Review Panel that includes representatives from the
14 Department of Education, the Department of Public Safety,
15 the American Automobile Association, the Maine Highway
16 Safety Commission, law enforcement agencies, the insurance
17 industry, the motor carrier industry and a driver education
18 teacher and instructor. The Technical Review Panel shall
19 assist the Secretary of State in developing curriculum and
20 teacher and instructor training and certification.
